ONLINE REGISTRATION VIA BANNER

- *You can look for class openings, complete registration, and add or drop for J-Term 2010;
 - *After you receive your Packet, see your Faculty Advisor to complete all forms, get their signature/approval and your Enrollment PIN number;
 - *Go to the current student resource page: <http://www.okbu.edu/current-students/>
 - *Click on Banner (Online Registration) or Self Service Banner (Online Registration);
 - *Your User Name is your 6-digit OBU ID number with a leading 0 to make 7 digits;
 - *Your Login PIN number is your birth date in the DDMMYY format UNLESS YOU HAVE CHANGED IT, if so, use that number as your login PIN;
 - *Click on Student and Financial Aid;
 - *Click on Registration Status to see if you have any Holds - if so, contact the office placing the Hold;
 - *Click Search by Term - J-Term 2010 (view only), click SUBMIT;
 - *Class Schedule Search screen will come up -
 - Choose Subject (Department, such as ACCOUNTING);
 - Choose ALL for Instructional Method, Course Level, Part of Term and Instructor;
 - *Click CLASS SEARCH;
 - *To register or change, click Add/Drop Courses;
 - *Click on term J-Term 2010 and enter your 7-digit ID number;
 - *Enter the CRN's (Course Reference Numbers - same as IFAS Call Number) for the courses desired and click SUBMIT;
- If there are closed classes, ineligible courses, time conflicts, or courses needing approval, that message will appear on your screen.
- *When you are ready to enroll in the courses shown on your screen, click Submit Changes.
 - *Click on Student Detail Schedule to view and/or print the schedule of courses in which you have enrolled.
- If you cannot complete the enrollment for any reason, bring your signed card to the Academic Center, Thurmond Hall, main floor, north end.

**Spring 2010: Nov 2-January 25: New students must make a \$125 enrollment guarantee.
After January 25: \$50.00 late registration fee + payment according to Payment Plan selected.**

**REGISTRATION STATIONS WILL BE OPEN DURING REGULAR OFFICE HOURS (8:00 A.M.-5:00 P.M.)

- SENIORS (90+ HOURS ALREADY EARNED) - NOVEMBER 2 - 3**

- FRESHMEN (LESS THAN 30 HOURS ALREADY EARNED) - NOVEMBER 16 - 20**

Step 1: Students not currently enrolled in OBU must secure a Permit to Enrol and Enrollment Packet from the Admissions Office, Thurmond Hall. Former students who completed a Leave of Absence form in the Academic Center before leaving OBU may secure their Enrollment Packet in the Academic Center, Thurmond Hall 201.

Step 2: Continuing students will receive Enrollment Packets in their campus mail boxes. Students without campus mail boxes pick up Packets in Academic Center, Thurmond Hall 201.

Step 3: Counsel with Faculty Advisor for all classes in the Enrollment Packet. IF YOU PLAN TO REGISTER YOURSELF ONLINE, you must obtain a PIN number as well as SIGNATURE ON THE REGISTRATION CARD from your Dean for any overloads (more than 13 hours if conditional or probationary, 10 hours if in good standing). Limit to 4 hours for J-Term for all students. Overload requests must be approved by your academic Dean.

Step 4: All previous terms must be paid in full. Students are allowed to enroll. Even if you do not have a balance due, turn in a Promise to Pay card to the Registrar's window at least 24 hours prior to enrolling. Note: This step MUST be completed by all students, even those with waivers or full scholarship.

Step 5: Take all completed academic forms to the Academic Center, Thurmond Hall 201 for computer entry of course requests. NOTE: ALL PACKET FORMS ARE REQUIRED AT THIS STATION. IF YOU CHOOSE TO REGISTER YOURSELF ONLINE, PLEASE SEE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS.

ONLINE REGISTRATION VIA SELF-SERVICE BANNER

- 1. On the OBU website, click tab Current Students;**
- 2. On the menu, click Self-Service Banner;**
- 3. Enter User ID (a zero plus your OBU ID number);**
- 4. Enter your login PIN (your birth date in MMDDYY format IF YOU HAVE NOT ALREADY CHANGED IT!) If you have changed your PIN, use the new one - NOT your birthdate.**
- 5. Click on Student;**
- 6. Click on Registration;**
- 7. Click on Add or Drop classes;**
- 8. You will be asked for your alternate PIN number - that is the one your advisor gave you at the end of your counseling session;**
- 9. Enter the CRN's (course reference numbers) for the classes you selected with your advisor and follow the system prompts to complete your registration. If you encounter closed classes or classes that require a signature, you will need to bring your signed card to the Academic Center to complete registration.**

STUDENTS ARE REMINDED THAT THE FOLLOWING OBLIGATIONS, AS APPLICABLE, MUST BE MET BEFORE BEGINNING CLASS ATTENDANCE:

- a. Students with Financial Aid must meet all stated deadlines for application AND receipt/acknowledgement;
- b. All vehicles driven to/on campus must be registered in the Cashiers Office, Thurmond Hall first floor;
- c. Photo-ID cards must be made or updated in the Geiger Center, Student Development Office;
- d. Students on Church Vocations Scholarships must pick up the schedule for required meetings from Janet Burns, Owens Hall 112;

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FINANCIAL INFORMATION

SPRING

All charges for tuition, fees, room and board are due and payable at the beginning of the term. All charges not covered by payments or by financial aid (as certified by the Office of Student Financial Services) may be paid under a Semester Installment Plan, the three or five-payment plan.

Three-payment Plan: Payments for enrollment costs, less verified financial aid are due as follows: February 1, March 1 and April 1. A \$40 origination fee will be assessed for use of the payment plan. For any month a payment is late, a late payment fee of \$25 is charged.

Five-payment Plan: Payments for enrollment costs, less verified financial aid are due as follows: December 1; January 1; February 1; March 1; and April 1. A \$40 origination fee will be assessed for use of the payment plan. For any month a payment is late, a late payment fee of \$25 is charged.

J-TERM

One-half of all charges not covered by financial aid must be paid by the first day of class. The remainder of charges must be paid by the first day of the third week of class.

PREPAYMENTS REQUIRED

New students must make a \$125 enrollment guarantee deposit. This deposit is not refundable after November 1.

REFUNDS

If a student withdraws from school or decreases hours after classes begin, applicable credits for tuition, room rent, and fees will be computed according to the following schedule. Calculations for tuition and fees are based upon the date the student notifies the Academic Center **IN WRITING OR IN PERSON**. Credits for room rent and meals are based upon the date the student notifies Residential Life **IN WRITING OR IN PERSON** or **OFFICIALLY CHECKS OUT OF CAMPUS HOUSING, WHICHEVER IS LATER**.

Spring: Beginning with the first day and continuing for the first week after classes begin, the credit is 100%; second week, 80%; third week, 60%; fourth week, 40%. No credit is given after the fourth week of class.

J-Term: Within two academic days after classes begin, the credit is 100%; third day, 80%; fourth day, 60%; fifth day, 40%. No credit is given after the fifth academic day of class.

J-Term 2010 Topics Course Descriptions and Schedule Changes

- GNE 1999 K Topic: Success 102
 A Strengths' based academic recovery course designed to help students examine past habits and experiences in an effort to modify their approach to their overall educational experience in an effort to improve both scholarship, performance, and satisfaction. Students will participate in classroom discussion, develop and commit to a detailed personalized plan for personal and academic success, and build a team of support designed to mentor and encourage their endeavors.
- GNE 1999 L-P Topic: Christian Worldview (1 credit)
 An examination of the foundations of a Christian worldview, its relationship to culture, and its importance to Christian experience.
- REL 1999 A Topic: Studies in Discipleship (1 credit)
 A course held in conjunction with the *Life Impact* Conference, January 2-5, 2010, this course will examine the objective and impact of discipleship on one's life.

REL 1999 B Topic: Parables in the Gospel of Matthew (1 credit)

Student must attend either of the January Bible Studies of Dr. Bobby Kelly and complete a written assignment: Quail Springs Baptist Church (Jan. 10-13, Sunday morning and evening worship times and MTW evening times TBA), second site TBA (Jan. 17-20, Sunday morning and evening worship times and MTW evening times TBA).
